EDUCATING WORLD-CLASS WINEMAKERS IN CROATIA

The Croatian Scholarship Fund is proud to announce that Mr. Miljenko Grgich established an Endowment Fund with CSF. This fund will provide scholarships to university students in Croatia, majoring in viticulture and enology.

Mr. Grgich's goal is to help educate bright Croatian winemakers and to turn Croatia into a world-class haven for winemaking. This visionary goal shows Mr. Grgich's commitment for a better and prosperous Croatia. He was born in a small village of Desne, Croatia, on the Dalmatian Coast, and his father taught him how to make wine. He later attended the University of Zagreb, where he studied viticulture and enology and this prepared him for his endeavors in becoming a winemaker. He fled from former Yugoslavia in 1954, in search of freedom, and eventually settled in Napa Valley, California. While living in Napa, Mr. Grgich perfected his craft and became a world renowned winemaker. He has never forgotten his roots and since the end of the war in Croatia, Mr. Grgich has been in the forefront of influencing the Croatian winemaking industry. He has opened a winery on Peljesac Peninsula, Croatia, and has introduced the latest technology in winemaking.

Croatian Scholarship Fund, along with rest of the Croatian community, is extremely proud of Mr. Grgich's accomplishments. We are all touched to see Mr. Grgich use the Croatian Coat of Arms on the very first bottle of wine he produced in the United States and since then, has become his trademark.

Croatian Scholarship Fund is honored and would like to thank Mr. Grgich for his trust in establishing the Endowment Fund with CSF. His decision to invest in Croatian viticulture and enology studies and his goal for young Croatians to become world-class winemakers is exemplary. 

Rosemary Dixon, Executive Board Member

Rosemary Dixon, maiden name Basić, was born in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. Her parents immigrated to Canada from Perušić, Lika, Croatia in 1928 and 1939.

At the age of six, Rosemary, her brother Edward, and her parents returned to then Yugoslavia in 1947 as so-called "povratnici." "Povratnici" was a mass exodus of mostly Croatian immigrants from Canada, the United States, Australia and New Zealand. These immigrants were returning "home," in hope of rebuilding life on their native soil and to help rebuild the country after a devastating WWII.

Rosemary remembers "six ships that left Canada and my parents, like other returnees, sold their homes and took with them all of their belongings." The family was placed in Osijek, but within six months her parents wanted to return to Canada. However, the new government denied their exit visas and it took them four years to clandestinely leave the country. The family once again fled communist Yugoslavia and returned to Canada and starting life as immigrants for the second time was not easy for the family. At age ten, Rosemary had to learn English again and she started the first grade.

In 1966, Rosemary married the late Dr. F. Gene Dixon, a prominent dentist in the Bay Area, who was a widower with four young children. Together, they had a daughter, Kathryn, currently living in London. Gene, the founder of Delta Dental Insurance, a visionary in the field of dentistry, believed that every person has a right to dental health.

Rosemary believes that "investing in young people through education is the best way to contribute." Rosemary is a founding member of the Croatian Visiting Scientists Fund, Stanford School of Medicine, where young and brilliant Croatian scientists with graduate degrees are able to make a contribution in cutting edge cancer research. "The reason I joined CSF is because my roots and ties are still in Croatia."



Anamaria Brozović, Ph.D., CSF Advisory Board Member

Anamaria was born in Duga Resa, Croatia, where her entire family still resides. Upon completion of her bachelor and master degrees at the Faculty of Science, University of Zagreb, she was awarded the prestigious DAAD scholarship from the German Government. She spent two and a half years conducting research for her dissertation at the Institute for Toxicology, University of Mainz, Germany.

Currently, she is a research scientist at Rudjer Bošković Institute in Zagreb, Croatia. However, for the past two and a half years, Anamaria has been conducting cancer research under tutelage of Prof. Branimir I. Šikić, M.D. at the Oncology Department, Stanford School of Medicine, through the Croatian Visiting Scientists Fund.

Shortly upon her arrival at Stanford University, Anamaria had the opportunity to meet with several Croatian Americans, who introduced her to the work of CSF. "This introduction helped me to understand the importance of CSF. It also made me aware that CSF is not just a fund but a live organization comprised of passionate volunteers who, with hard work and dedication, help needy students in Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina. Besides assisting Croatian students, they also help young professionals, like me, and they provide us with lots of love, advice, and emotional support." Anamaria states that, "the reason I joined the Advisory Board of CSF is not only because I admire the work and idea of CSF but also because I want to return what was so generously given to me."



Maria Olujić, Ph.D., Executive Board Member

Maria Olujić was born in Imotski, Croatia, and immigrated to the U.S. at the age of twelve. Maria has a bachelor's degree in Biology and a doctorate in Anthropology, both from U.C. Berkeley. While a graduate student at Berkeley, she received a Fulbright Award. In 1991, when the war was raging in Croatia, Maria was invited to work as the Deputy Minister of Science and Technology for the newly forming nation of Croatia. After leaving the government work, Maria taught Anthropology as a Visiting Professor at U.C. Berkeley and also "Semester at Sea Program." She was awarded the prestigious Guggenheim Award to conduct anthropological research on gendered violence, especially on war rapes in Croatia and Bosnia.

Maria joined CSF because her parents, Mate and Slava Buljan, have been long-time supporters of CSF. Maria specifically joined because she feels "that education is the most effective way to make a difference and also a way to contribute to society." She remembers a time during the war when she, along with her colleagues in Croatia, had to decide whether to spend money on a tank, or develop the first computer network (CarNet at that time). They chose the network instead of a tank—not an easy decision during a war-and at that time, only the White House had a computer network and the Croatian President's office was the second. "Without brilliant young minds, this would not have been possible to accomplish and that is the reason I support CSF because we are investing in the future."

Letter From **A Student**



Hrvatskí:

In the last three years in September and April the white CSF envelopes have come to my home address. In these months my mother is usually more careful and more often checks mailbox. She said that she is afraid because the CSF envelope is longer than our *mailbox so it always jut out and maybe somebody could take it.* Maybe because our mailbox is made only for bills and shopping flyers and isn't supposed for something that has value, especially not financial value.

CSF scholarship means to me less worries about paying the rent, buying books, travelling to college and returning home. Besides that financial side it means and so much more: The thought that someone far away, on another continent, who's never seen you, and maybe never will, who doesn't know your personality grants you his money, takes care of your studies, wants you to become intellectual. And, above all he does it all without expecting any benefit. This feeling is greater than any amount of money. It *cannot just fit in a few words, as CSF envelope does not fit in my* mailbox.

I am grateful to my donors Marijana and Zeljko Pavic. I keep all of their letters because they are proofs of the great people in this small world.

Accepting Student Applications

During this time of the year, as we have done for the past 24 years, the Croatian Scholarship Fund is in the process of accepting applications from graduating high school students of Croatian descent, living in Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina. These students who are applying to various universities in Croatia and B & H must demonstrate proof of admission into one of the universities, before CSF officially processes their application.

The CSF application deadline is May 15th, at which time the CSF Selection Committee screens all applicants using a point system selection process. The Selection Committee then recommends selected scholarship recipients to the Executive Board for final approval. This year we will be accepting 17 students and the total number of students in the program will be 50.

CSF's goal is to reach out to all high schools in Croatia and B & H and recruit students who show academic superiority, and demonstrate financial need. Each applicant is asked to submit multiple documents including, but not limited to, official transcripts, a personal statement, unique accomplishments, family earnings, letters of recommendations, and proof of Croatian citizenship.

The screening process for scholarship recipients is rigorous and time consuming. We always have more applicants than we can accommodate and, therefore, we continue to look for additional student sponsors, so that we can aid more students.

The applicants accepted into the program demonstrate highest academic performance and financial need. These students will receive an annual scholarship of \$1,500 that is renewable for four years, making the total scholarship at \$6,000. CSF monitors their academic work and scholarship checks are issued twice a year, after each semester and after students' grades are evaluated. These procedures are conducted for every student in the program. CSF is fortunate to have Mrs. Vesna Brekalo, our student liaison, who does an exceptional job in monitoring, tracking, and corresponding with the students.
